SUNSCREEN – Important information

- From the beginning of October to the end of April, sunhats & sunscreen are compulsory.
- On bad weather days, Head Teachers will decide, based on forecast & UVR indication from the UVlens app, whether sun screen needs to be applied.
- For children who arrive at the centre before 8.30am, staff will apply sunscreen before 10am.
- **All children who arrive at the centre between 8.30am & 12.30pm, it will be the responsibility of the parents/caregivers to apply sunscreen to their children. The centre will make available sunscreen for parents to use. This will be placed at the sign in desk in the foyer. If your child arrives after the application times, please apply sunscreen before you arrive.**
- Sunscreen will be applied at approximately 12.30pm & 2.30 pm to all children.
- UVR levels will be checked by the UVlens App between May and September. If the UVR levels are 3 or above, after 10am and before 4pm, we will apply sunscreen.
- On the days specified above, children and staff will wear hats when outside. Children not wearing hats will be asked to play indoors.
- The centre will supply appropriate sunhats. These will be washed after each use.
- Children and adults will be encouraged to wear 'Sunsmart' clothes, i.e., t-shirts rather than singlet tops.
- The centre will have available a broad spectrum reputable sunscreen for use. Children under 1 year of age will not have sunscreen applied unless parents request this and provide their own sunscreen.
- **If a child is excluded from using the Centre's sunscreen then their parent /caregiver / whānau will be required to provide a named sunscreen for their child and a sunscreen form completed and signed.**
- Staff and Management will work together to provide a 'Sunsafe' environment.

We do provide sunhats for the children but if you would like to bring a hat for your child it must be named and we are not responsible if it goes missing.

Parent Questionnaire Summary

Firstly we would like to say a big Thank you to all the parents that took the time to fill in the parent survey, it has provided us with some very useful information on which we can strengthen our practice within the centre. The results have been very positive with many of you believing that you have a good partnership with your child/ren's teachers. Some very valuable comments have been made about what these partnerships look like, mostly around communication with many comments being made on having a shared interest, authentic concern, and teachers being there

to chat. It has been noted that parents are aware of the busyness of the centre at drop off and pick up times and know that it can be a struggle to talk then, suggestions have been made that we have times that we can talk or even a parent/teacher evening where parents can come and talk with their child's key teacher. There were a few parents that noted that they wanted to get to know more about the teacher with one suggesting that we highlight a teacher in newsletter like we have been for the board members. We think that this is a fantastic idea and will start doing that this month. Parents have also noted that they would like to more involved in their children's learning and have more feedback on what has happened during the day at Preschool. There were a few comments made about the profile book and how often parents look at them. We would like you all to know that you are able to take these books home as often as you like, please feel free to add pictures and stories of your own. There were also some comments of concern to us as some parents felt uninvolved in their child's learning, this is an area we will be working hard to correct. We also want to continue to develop your understanding of why we plan for your child/ren's using the process that we do and making sure that you feel fully involved in your child/ren's learning journey. Here is our action plan so far

- Having a daily feedback pin board about what is happening that day from both Nursery and Preschool
- To make sure that all parents are welcomed when they arrive and said goodbye to when leaving.
- Introducing staff through our newsletter – starting in October
- Possibly looking in to holding a mini parent/teacher interview type evening
- Look into having a parent information evening – teacher lead
- Letting Whanau know our methods of communication between us as staff
- Making sure we are involving whanau in decisions about their child/ren's learning
- Letting parents know that they are able to look at and take home profile books at any time.
