This month in the Nursery we were very lucky to have a grant approved from The Four Winds Foundation so that we could purchase two new wooden kitchens for the children. It was very exciting when they arrived as not only did we have the kitchens, we also had many giant cardboard boxes to play in! The kitchens are being used every day, both inside and out. This play is developing our children's' imagination and social skills, as they are actively experimenting with what they have seen and



implementing this in to their play so they can make sense of the world around them.

Kaiako Chelsey has also been setting up some lovely huts outside, so we can all hide away in the shade, have quiet time and read to one another. The children have loved having these spaces available to them, and have enjoyed being there either by themselves, or with their peers lying on



the beanbags reading away to each other. Our immobile babies have also really enjoyed having this space in the shade and being able observe the other children around them.

As it has been quite hot these last few weeks, water play has been a huge part of our days. We have enjoyed having lots of water in the sand pit and getting really messy!!! Sitting and splashing in the puddles in the sand is a form of sensory play and allows the children to develop all of their senses, as well as their physical development, and social and emotional skills!



This month we welcome Henry, Brendon, Harry, Logan, and their Whānau in to the Nursery. We are all very excited to get to know you and your families more.

We have lots of unnamed clothing at the moment. Please ask one of our Nursery Kaiako to show you where the basket is.



With the lovely warm weather please provide us with lots of clothes as we will be using water most days. If your child has a swim t-shirt you are welcome to bring this

along too as we will be getting out the paddling pool as well.

SUNSCREEN QUESTIONNAIRE

Thank you to all those who completed our survey regarding changes we wish to make to our sunscreen policy. As we are right in the height of summer we will be continuing as we are for the time being. Hats & sunscreen compulsory.

The main reason for the delay is that we are very lucky to be receiving a full weather station from the company that developed the UVlens app that we use for our UV levels. They normally only provide it (at a cost) to high schools. Due to the technology part being a bit complicated. However we have a wonderful tech person, Stephan Williamson, who is happy to come and set it up for us.

It will provide not only the temperature, wind, humidity etc but the accurate UV level through the day. This means we will have an actual reading and we will work with it to see how we may make our Sunsmart policy even more effective.

Another bonus is that our actual reading will be able to be downloaded to their app to give an accurate level not an estimated, that everyone in Darfield can use.

So please bear with us while we get this fantastic facility up and running (once it arrives) 😊

TERRACYCLE RECYCLING PROGRAMME


