Group togetherness has been a big focus in the Nursery this month.

We have had lots of tamariki interested in mat times, singing songs or reading books alongside their peers. This is a great time for our little people to learn how to learn with and alongside others and to initiate and enjoy relationships with each other. Bubbles, group art and messy play experiences and kai time are other things we have been enjoying together this month.





Often children will initiate a group sing-a-long by beginning some actions to one of our favourite songs or heading to the cupboard where our special finger puppets and magnetic songs are kept, asking to have them out. It is fantastic to see tamariki leading their own learning and following their own interests like this! If you would like a paper copy of the lyrics to some of our favourite songs – sing out! ☺



We have also observed lots of physical development from our littlest of friends! It always amazes us how the tamariki naturally develop the muscles and co-ordination they need to move and learn, if we give them the space and time to navigate their bodies with minimal aide and interruption from us. In fact, the less we help our pepi, the better their muscles can form optimally. Have a look at our print out in the Nursery entrance regarding natural spine positions.

This month we have also noticed a keen interest in self-help skills. With many of our pepi enjoying exploring their kai using spoons and bowls. They are just loving exploring the different textures and tastes.

It looks like August is shaping up to be a cold month. Please send plenty of warm layers to Nursery with your

child – we try and get outside, even for a little while, every day – whatever the weather.

### **PRESCHOOL HAS BEEN SO BUSY.....**

July has been an inspiring month for our tamariki with many planned and spontaneous experiences to challenge their thinking. Child initiated mat times have seen many tamariki lead their own board stories, songs and stories. These experiences develop their understanding of sequencing in stories whilst being directors of their own learning.

Sport experiences such as rugby, soccer and cricket have featured for many older tamariki who have scaffolded their skills with the younger ones.

We celebrated Matariki with an array of experiences throughout the month from numerous stories and legends being retold, to songs being sung and we also created artwork for tamariki to revisit their learning.

Carpentry and construction has seen many tamariki involve themselves in various ways. Tamariki have learnt the safety rules required for carpentry and applied this to their wonderful creations.

Our school holiday programme theme was involving the community and we were fortunate to offer tamariki a range of community based experiences to provide them with an understanding of the roles these members have. During week one we went to the library for arts and crafts, Darfield Veterinary Clinic, had Kirwee Bees and Darfield Police visit us followed by a movie and pyjama day. Week two saw us go to McHugh's Forest, have a camping day, go to the Air Force Museum and Darfield Primary School playground, had an ambulance visit and popped along to the Fat Beagle for fluffies.





Different science experiments have provoked tamariki minds with experiences such as dye changing the colour of flowers, baking soda frozen with water to create fizziness when mixed with vinegar and creation of colours when mixed with other colours.



Transition visits have seen tamariki visit from the nursery to the preschool, combined trip to Almond Park as well as visits to Sheffield and Darfield Primary Schools in the community van.

We are looking forward to next month where we will continue extending nga tamariki as they have fun whilst playing and learning.
